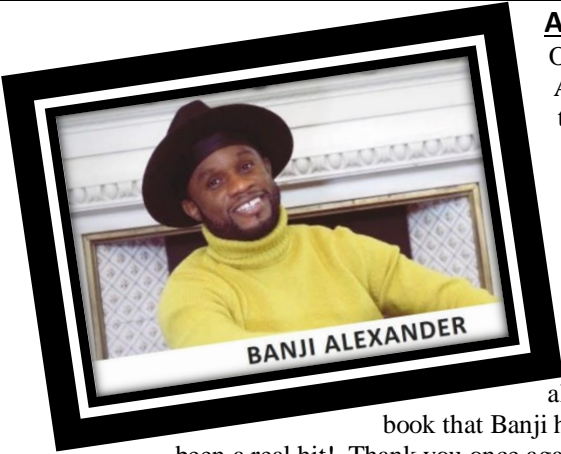

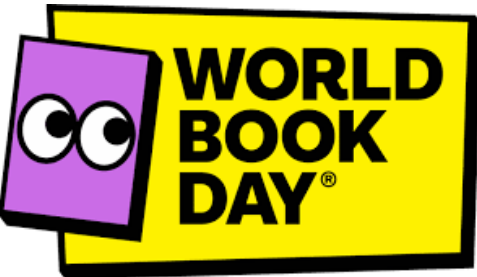


Author Visit

Field of Study: On the Farm This half term, our Field of Study was “*On the Farm*”, and the children learnt all about farm animals and how plants grow from seeds. 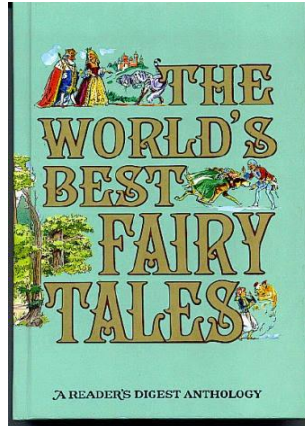

Pre-school

We were able to learn lots of new maths skills such as big, small, empty and full with the help of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We had so much fun at our stay and play in forest school exploring like the characters in our stories.



Reception

Our Reception class is excited to begin our new topic, “Ready, Steady, Grow!” over the coming weeks, the children will be exploring the wonderful world of farms. They will learn about the different animals that live on farms, how farmers help care for them, and the important role farms play in providing the food we eat every day.

The children will also discover the names of baby animals and develop their understanding of where food comes from. As part of our learning, we will enjoy a range of fruit and vegetable tasting activities, encouraging the children to try new foods and talk about their favourites.

To bring our learning to life, we hope to finish the topic with an exciting trip to a farm, where the children will have the opportunity to see farm animals up close and experience the farm environment for themselves. We are looking forward to a fun and engaging topic filled with exploration, discovery, and hands-on learning!



Year 1

This term has been a busy and exciting one for our Year 1 children, filled with lots of wonderful learning experiences and memorable moments. One of the highlights of the term was our fantastic trip into London. The children thoroughly enjoyed their visit to the London Eye, where they were able to take in the incredible views across the city, as well as the river boat cruise along the Thames. It was a brilliant opportunity to bring their learning to life and explore our capital city first-hand. In English, the children have loved reading *The Tower Bridge Cat*. They engaged brilliantly with the story and showed great creativity by producing their own podcasts inspired by the book. It was wonderful to see their confidence grow as they shared ideas and brought their storytelling to life. In Maths, we have recently completed our unit on measurement. The children have been learning to measure length, height, weight, and capacity, using both practical activities and problem-solving tasks to deepen their understanding. We are very proud of all the children for their enthusiasm and hard work this term. Thank you, as always, for your continued support.



Year 2

What a great half term! We have loved our new topic ‘Long Live the King’ where we have been learning about different monarchs across history. This learning was further embedded during our trip to Blenheim Palace, where we learnt about the history of the palace and explored the beautiful grounds and rooms. 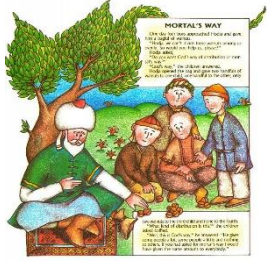
Year 3

Year 5
