Dear Parents and Carers,

At last term's parents' evenings many of you filled out a questionnaire about your views of the school and your child's education and a good number talked to a governor at the time.

These questionnaires are important to staff and governors to get your opinions of our work in a representative fashion. We study the responses in some detail and a report on them is always discussed at a Governor Meeting. However, we thought, as you have gone to the trouble of filling in these important forms, we ought to let you know what the school community was feeling about your responses.

We received 175 of them, and I am pleased to say that they were both statistically significant and overwhelmingly positive.

Two thirds of you **strongly** agreed that your child is happy at school and 96% agreed that they were happy. The answers to the question about your child feeling safe were almost exactly the same. This is really pleasing. School is, of course, about learning, but children do not learn well if they don't feel happy and safe. So, making sure that they do is a vitally important aim for us, and we are really pleased that you feel that we are hitting the target,

Over 90% of you agreed that Thomas Hickman Birds are well behaved. This too is pleasing but not something we will ever take for granted. Some young children find it hard to understand the rules which they need to obey and a small number are a real challenge. It is great that you feel that we are meeting that challenge and your responses very much encourages those who put in so much work to achieve it.

It is part of life that children fall out with each other, but it is very important to us that this does not become bullying. It is pleasing that a significant majority did not feel that their child had been bullied at school and, of those who felt that they had, most said that the school had handled the matter quickly and effectively. This is something that we keep under continual review – governors and staff alike have zero tolerance of bullying.

Over 90% of you agreed that, when you have raised concerns, the school has dealt with them promptly.

Over 90% of you felt that your child is doing well at Thomas Hickman. This is very encouraging for our staff who work hard to try to ensure that children achieve as much as they possibly can. Indeed, it is perhaps the key measure of how well the school is doing. This is not something on which we can or will compromise. We are very glad to see that you believe that your child is doing well at Thomas Hickman but we will continue to push them to do the best that they can.

Over 90% of you felt that there was a good range of subjects taught at the school and that the school supported your child's wider personal development. A similar number felt that there was a good range of clubs and activities for them to partake in. We expanded the number of clubs last year and we hope to continue to do so. However, it is important to remember that the staff who run these activities are volunteers doing it in addition to their paid work.

I am grateful that the vast majority of you would recommend our school to others. I am proud of what we are achieving at Thomas Hickman and am glad that parents recognise it too.

While I thank you for your very positive responses to our questionnaire, I am very aware that it is a snapshot at one moment and we will have to work hard as a school to maintain and, indeed, improve your opinions of us. I am also aware that a lot of parents did not fill in the questionnaire. If you are one of them, please do reply at your next parents evening. We want to know your opinion and I hope that this letter shows that we value it.
