**Reception**

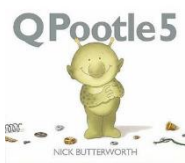

**Year 1**

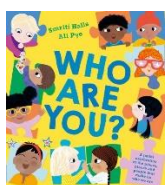

**Year 1 Wonders**

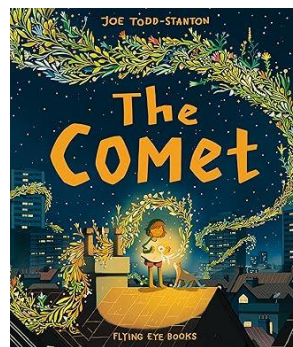
We have been very busy over the last few weeks. We have been reading *Who Are You?* By Smriti Halls and Ali Pye, and learning all about what makes us, us. We have also been looking at what we like and don't like using sensory materials and foods. Learning that it is OK to have different interests and to take turns has been really important this term, and we will carry on practicing this.



**Year 2**

Year 2 really enjoyed their assembly from a member of the National Paralympic Heritage Trust, she spoke to Year 2 about the story of the Paralympics and what we can expect when we visit Stoke Mandeville Stadium on the 10th of November. We recently had our Amazing Animals science experience where we learned all about what animals need to survive, played science games and activities, and categorised animals into their scientific groups. We also got to see a model animal skull!

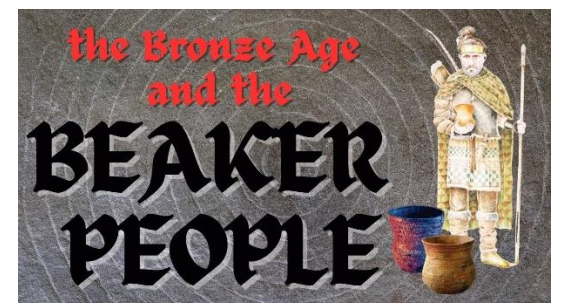
In English, we have really been enjoying our book 'The Comet' and have been practising writing in the character of Nyla. We have also read a poem called 'The Moon' and writing our very own versions in the form of a diamante poem! A letter with your child's part and lines was sent home on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> October. Please practice it with them until they know it off by heart!



**Year 3**

In Year 3 we have been learning about the end of the Stone Age and how the Bronze Age began, when the Beaker Folk migrated here from Europe and introduced the metal bronze as well as their unique pottery style. This changed life in Britain dramatically, making many tasks such as farming and cooking food easier. More people began to live in established farming settlements. In Maths we have been looking at different methods of addition and subtraction. In English we have been crafting balanced arguments about whether people should be allowed to fox hunt. If you were able to attend our Harvest festival. Thank you.

We have had to change the date of our trip to the Chiltern Open Air Museum so that the children don't miss out on the Pantomime that will be visiting the school. The trip will now go ahead on 25th November.





**Year 4**

This autumn term has been buzzing with excitement for our Year 4 children! We kicked things off with an action-packed Anglo-Saxon Discovery Day, where the students dived into history by crafting artefacts that might have been used during that fascinating time. In the afternoon, budding archaeologists sifted through sand, uncovering primary sources of information, some of which dated back to the Anglo-Saxon era—a truly hands-on experience!

In maths, the children completed their first Multiplication Times table Check. There's plenty of hard work ahead as we strive to master all our times tables up to 12; we're determined to smash that test in the summer term!

In English, the focus has been on enhancing our writing skills. The students have been using expanded noun phrases and up levelling their sentences with fronted adverbials, making their descriptions more vivid and engaging.

Our science lessons have revolved around teeth and the importance of oral hygiene, helping the children understand how to care for their smiles. Lastly, in computing, we've been learning the essentials of staying safe online, ensuring our young digital citizens are well-prepared for the digital world. What a fantastic start to the year!

Year 6 have homework set every week and are expected to complete it - your on-going support with this is crucial in the children achieving well. Maths is set using My Maths and reading is either on Reading Eggs or Reading plus (Dreambox) if your child is doing that - we will have spoken about it at Parent's Evening. Frequently Asked Questions

How much do Drama Kids classes cost?

Our one-hour long classes cost £10.50 each week. This is then calculated per term. (For example, a 12 week term would cost £126). We can accept payments for the full term, or we can organise monthly payments - contact the Principal for this option.

What is the two-week trial?

The two-week trial is an opportunity for your child to experience our class without a full-term commitment. It costs £20 for the two weeks, which must be paid in full. Following the two-week trial, you can then enrol your child for the remainder of the term (with payment plans available as mentioned)

Do I have to wait until the start of a term?

No! You can enrol your child into our classes at any point in the term, as long as there are spaces! Each class follows the same structure, with unique speech exercises, movement activities and script work, that they can drop into any class and be able to access the curriculum.

My child has an additional need/disability. Can they join?

Of course! We have years of experience working with children from a variety of backgrounds with additional needs. This includes learning and physical disabilities. If your child needs particular access arrangements and/or adaptations, these can be discussed with the Principal, to allow your child to access the class.
